On 15 April, MJIIT successfully hosted Japan Day 2025, welcoming over 1,000 attendees for a vibrant celebration of cultural exchange and technological innovation. Organized in collaboration with the Embassy of Japan, JICA, and Japan Foundation Kuala Lumpur (JFKL), the event highlighted the Malaysia-Japan partnership effort. The day featured an exciting blend of traditional and contemporary Japanese experiences—from captivating performances and martial arts demonstrations to interactive workshops that immersed participants in Japanese culture. The event also included a Research Exhibition and Recruitment Expo, with the recruitment segment coorganized by JACTIM, connecting students with Japanese companies and showcasing MJIIT's cuttingedge research. STEM competitions engaged more than 250 students, promoting hands-on learning and creativity. Themed food trucks, cultural booths, and student-led initiatives also added to the festive atmosphere. In conjunction with Japan Day, MJIIT also held the Workshop on How to Get Yourself Employed (HTGYE) on 14 April for final-year undergraduate students. The workshop aimed to prepare graduating students for the job market, offering insights into job hunting strategies, resume preparation, and interview readiness. Six participating companies and agencies shared practical advice, featuring a mock interview exercise that portray actual recruitment scenarios.
